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2019 Boat Captain Rules and Boat Regulations

- 1) You are the **only person** who will operate the big engine during the tournament day. Students may assist with launching and loading only.
- 2) All parties of the boat are to have **life jackets fastened properly** and boat captain to have **kill switch attached** anytime the motor is running.
- 3) **Captains will provide life vests** for all students aboard their boat.
- 4) Student may elect to wear jacket all day
- 5) You may operate the trolling motor if students are not skilled.
- 6) **Boat captains cannot fish** but can help in netting fish and maintaining live-well.
- 7) Even though students are to have own tackle, captains may loan equipment if needed.
- 8) **Boat captains are to take the SAFEST route** to any location allowing for wind, stumps and obstructions. Captains are to **monitor weather conditions** such as high wind or lightning in approaching storms and **remove students from potential dangerous situations**. You may put boat on trailer until conditions improve, continue fishing once storm has cleared.
- 9) Captains are to keep a charged cell phone in the boat for safety concerns.
- 10) Boats need to have:
 - a. Throw cushion
 - b. Whistle or signaling device
 - c. Current Boat registration
 - d. Fire extinguisher
 - e. Kill switch
 - f. Must have working navigational lights
 - g. Have adequate storage for tackle, rods, and drinks
 - h. HP cannot exceed capacity plate on board
- 11) **Mandatory Pre-Tournament Meeting Friday, July 19, 2019, 6:30 pm at Oak Ridge Marina -Tournament Headquarters.**
- 12) Launch Sites: The Lake Fork Open tournament allows "trailing". Please allow for transit to arrive on time for weigh in. No boat can launch before 5:00 am. **First cast is at 6:00 am. You MUST check in by your assigned flight time.**
- 13) Weigh-in/Check-in will be at Oak Ridge Marina. **All Anglers must be checked in by their assigned flight time. There will be a lakeside check-in boat and a street side check-in tent to ensure anglers are counted as arrived "on-time" in the event of long weigh-in lines.** Weigh-in bags will be provided at weigh-in pavilion or by fish handlers. Weigh-in will be at the stage near the Oak Ridge pavilion on the lake.
- 14) **All boats MUST check in regardless of any fish caught.** This is to ensure all boats arrived in safely.
- 15) Contestants must provide the weigh master with assigned Team Number provided at registration. (Bring Team #/Flight Card to weigh-in.)
- 16) Five (5) fish bag, all fish must be under 16" or 24" or longer to comply with the Texas Parks & Wildlife slot limit for all largemouth Bass caught on Lake Fork. Each Angler is allowed only one (1) Bass larger than 24" per day. A one (1) pound penalty for any dead fish or any slot fish (16"-24") weighed in will be applied.

Captains, these anglers are the future of our sport, be patient and "Teach them Well!"

National Lake Fork Scholarship Tournament Rules

The Lake Fork Area Chamber of Commerce, appointed Tournament Director, and the Lake Fork Open Committee advisors expect strict adherence to the following rules by all contestants. In the event of an emergency, please call 911 first and then notify the tournament director Micheal Rogge at 903-440-0525.

- 1. INTERPRETATION & ENFORCEMENT** - These rules will remain unchanged for the 2019 year event. Interpretation and enforcement of these rules will be left exclusively to the tournament director. Decisions of the tournament director are final in all matters and are not subject to appeal. Each contestant and coach agrees to report any rule violation to the tournament director immediately upon discovery of the violation. Failure to report violations may be cause for disqualification. The violation of a tournament rule may result in weight loss (late penalty, dead-fish penalty and short-fish penalty), the loss of weight up to a particular time in the tournament day, the loss of weight for the entire day, disqualification from the entire tournament or, in an extreme circumstance, ineligibility to participate in future Lake Fork Open High School Fishing tournaments. Protests are to be made in writing within 15 minutes of the check-in time of the final flight of each tournament day.
- 2. PARTICIPATION AND ELIGIBILITY** - Participation is open to U.S. High School students including all incoming 9th graders, 10th, 11th, 12th graders, and graduating seniors providing that the graduating seniors have not begun taking college courses since graduating at the time of the tournament dates. The entry fee for this tournament is \$50 per team. No more than two team members and an approved boat captain are allowed in a boat. Participation is open to all B.A.S.S. High School Nation, TBF Student Angler Federation, and any other non-affiliated high school fishing program. **If a student does not have a fishing program at their high school, they will need to show proof of being a student in good standing with the most current report card or letter from school officials.** Contestants must also have the signature of a parent or legal guardian in the provided space on the liability release form which will accompany the entry form. Contestants must have in their possession a current student identification card from the school they are representing (or proof of grade level for those home schooled) and a valid fishing license for the waters they fish (for ages 17+ in the state of Texas). In order to be eligible to compete in the Lake Fork Open, contestants must have passing grades in all subjects enrolled. Contestants are required to follow all applicable federal, state and local regulations and laws. Any violation of such regulations and laws may result in disqualification from the tournament. Each team will consist of one or two eligible contestants and one boat captain. Tournament officials reserve the right to reject any application to fish for any reason whatsoever.
- 3. PURCHASING OF INFORMATION** - The purchasing of, or bartering for, information about locating or catching fish on tournament waters, including but not limited to GPS waypoints (other than through commercially available sources) and the hiring of a fishing guide **(that operates on tournament waters) by contestants or coaches within 15 days of the tournament dates is not permitted.** Violation of this rule may result in disqualification.
- 4. OFF-LIMITS, PRACTICE AND COMPETITION** – Contestants may launch their boats and be on the water at 5:00 am the mornings of the tournament. Fishing will begin at 6:00 am. Check-in (either boat side or street side) for the first flight will be at 1:00 pm each day. Flight numbers will be assigned at Registration. Flight return times will be reversed on the second day. Each team will receive an information card with their boat numbers and flight times. There is no practice period or off-limits period. You may be on tournament waters anytime until the start of the pre-tournament meeting. Contestants and coaches may not enter tournament waters to locate bass, potential fishing waters or sightsee after the start of the pre-tournament meeting. Testing equipment on tournament waters after the start of the pre-tournament meeting is permitted only with prior approval from the tournament director. Once competition is under way, contestants and coaches may not solicit and/or receive information about locating or catching fish on tournament waters from anyone except contestants and coaches confirmed in the tournament and through publicly available sources (quasi-public websites set up for the specific purpose of sharing information with individuals or a small group of individuals are not publicly available sources). On competition day, teams may not follow a non-contestant’s boat or participate in the placing of markers by non-contestants or the practice of “hole sitting” by anyone. Violation of this rule may result in disqualification.
- 5. REGISTRATION AND PRE-TOURNAMENT MEETING** – **The pre-tournament meeting will start at 6:30 pm Friday 7/19/2019.** Registration deadline will be the Friday, July 19th prior to the tournament; the entry fee will be \$50 per team. Pre-registered teams by July 1,



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2019 will be eligible for free tournament T-shirt and early registration prize drawings. Contestants may late register on Saturday July 20st before 7:00 am, however there is no guarantee there will be gift bags still available for the late registration anglers.

6. **TOURNAMENT AWARDS** - The number of places awarded prizes based on their finish in the tournament will be as follows. First place through seventh place will be awarded college scholarships. (Two) Big Bass Awards (**largest single Bass each day**) will be awarded a college scholarship. Additional scholarships may be awarded based upon increased Sponsor participation and/or Sponsor designated criteria.
7. **SAFETY** - Safe boating must be observed at all times. Each contestant and coach is required to wear a fastened U.S. Coast Guard-approved and state approved personal flotation device anytime the combustion engine is in operation from launch until weigh-in each day of the tournament. All boats must be equipped with an emergency ignition-shutoff device that must be securely attached to the driver's body whenever the combustion engine is in operation. All persons in a tournament boat shall remain seated in a manufacturer recommended on-plane seating location when the combustion engine is in operation. Sitting on pedestal seats while the combustion engine is in operation is not permitted. With the exception of loading and unloading the boat at the launch ramp, coaches are the only individuals authorized to operate the combustion engine during the competition day. Safe boat conduct must be observed at all times by contestants and coaches. At the discretion of the tournament director, tournament days may be shortened, postponed or canceled due to unsafe weather or water conditions. Violation of this rule may result in disqualification.
8. **SPORTSMANSHIP** - All contestants and coaches are required to follow high standards of sportsmanship. Each should demonstrate courtesy, conservation, and conduct themselves in a manner that will be a credit to themselves, to the LAKE FORK AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, our sponsors, the school the team is representing, the sport of fishing and the efforts to promote the sport. Conduct not complying with these standards includes, but is not limited to, the following:
 - a. Violation of, or failure to comply with, any of the rules.
 - b. Consumption and/or possession of alcoholic beverages or any kind of mind-altering substance during registration, the pre- tournament meeting or during tournament hours extending through the weigh-in procedure.
 - c. Abuse of, or addiction to, mind-altering substances.
 - d. Conviction of a felony within the past 36 months.
 - e. Suspension/disqualification, probation or ban from any tournament or fishing organization.
 - f. Any words, conduct or actions reflecting unfavorably upon efforts to promote safety, sportsmanship, fair competition and compliance with tournament rules, or which fail to comply with the standards set forth in the first sentence of paragraph 8. In case of any conduct not complying with the standards outlined above, tournament officials have the right to refuse an application to compete, to deny a confirmed application to compete, or to disqualify a contestant.
9. **BOAT OPERATION** - Coaches must supply and drive boats for their teams. **Contestants may operate the boat to assist in launching and retrieving at the boat ramp.** To qualify as a boat captain, the person accompanying a team must be at least 19 years old and have not guided on the tournament waters in the **past 15 days**. At no time shall a boat captain be "Hired for Pay" to allow contestants to fish. Any boat captain deemed to give his contestants an unfair advantage by participation, may be refused or disqualified at the sole discretion of the tournament director. The Contestants may operate the trolling motor. Coaches may provide assistance, including information about locating and catching fish. **At no time are boat captains permitted to fish. The use of mobile communication devices are permitted only in the event of an on the water emergency or the taking of pictures. Use for any other reason during tournament hours will result in disqualification.**
10. **BOAT AND HORSEPOWER REGULATION** - All boats must be propeller-driven and a minimum of 16 feet in length. Each boat must have all required U.S. Coast Guard safety equipment. Boats must contain a properly aerated live well space to maintain alive a limit catch of bass. Maximum horsepower for all outboards shall not exceed the horsepower capacity set forth on the "Maximum Capacities" placard described below. Each boat must have a clearly legible "Maximum Capacities" (or comparably titled) placard that includes a maximum



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horsepower rating affixed to the boat by the manufacturer. By signing the entry form, contestants and coaches agree to submit their boat and/or motor to an inspection by tournament officials. Falsifying information on entry forms or altering the horsepower numbers on the motor or rating placard will be cause for disqualification from the tournament and may result in ineligibility to compete in future Lake Fork Open tournaments. Fishing platforms must be factory-installed equipment. No portable platforms may be used in tournament competition. Fuel may be carried only in factory-installed (built-in) fuel tanks or auxiliary fuel tanks that are securely strapped or otherwise fastened to the boat. Any additional fuel used during the tournament day must be purchased from a retail facility open to the public and pumped through a hose with a nozzle.

- 11. PERMITTED FISHING METHODS** - Fishing is defined as having a lure attached to a line and a rod and reel with the lure in the water. All bass must be caught alive in a conventional sporting manner. Only artificial lures may be used, with the exception of pork trailers and biodegradable soft baits. Only ONE fishing rod per contestant may be used at a time. Trolling as a method of fishing is strictly prohibited. All bass caught while sight-fishing must be hooked inside the mouth and immediately shown to your coach for verification.
- 12. PERMITTED FISHING LOCATIONS AND BOUNDARIES** - Teams may fish anywhere on tournament waters within the boundaries defined by the tournament director that is available to the public and accessible by boat, except areas designated as “off-limits,” “no boats,” “keep out,” “restricted,” “no trespassing” or “no fishing” (or similar language or markings intended to restrict public access) by tournament officials, local, state or federal officials, or within 50 yards of a contestant’s boat that was first anchored. An anchored boat is a boat held in a stable position by a line attached to a weight or by a Power-Pole or similar shallow water anchor with the trolling motor in the up position. All fishing must be conducted from the boat. At no time may a contestant leave the boat to land a fish or to make the boat more accessible to fishing waters. The use of cables, ropes, chains or any type of block and tackle system to maneuver a boat into fishing waters is strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification from the tournament. Due to the size and scope of this event, this will be a “Trailing” tournament. In the event of equipment failure or emergency, there are three permitted methods of returning to the check-in: (1) by both contestants remaining in their boat and being towed by water, (2) by one contestant entering the boat of another team with their catch or (3) both contestants entering a rescue boat with their catch so designated by the tournament director. Under these three conditions the team’s catch may be counted without a penalty (except for late penalties or other penalties pertaining to other tournament rules). Teams that elect to return to the check-in by any other means than cited above will forfeit their day’s catch to that point in time of the tournament day. Any team returning to the check-in point will be eligible to restart and resume competition under the supervision of the tournament director or his designated tournament official. It is the sole responsibility of teams to locate the tournament director to request a restart. Teams must remain together at all times and within sight of their coach until check-in. The momentary condition of being out of sight of each other for restroom breaks is permitted. Violation of this rule may result in disqualification.
- 13. WEIGH-IN/CHECK-IN** – **You can launch at 5:00 am but first cast will be 6:00 am. You must arrive at the check-in site by your assigned flight time. There will be a one (1) pound penalty for each minute you are late up to 15 minutes. After that your weight will not be counted.** The weigh-in/check-in point for all teams at the conclusion of each tournament competition day will be Oak Ridge Marina. There will be an official “Time Keeper” on the water and the street entrance to the marina that will record the check in times for each team at the end of each competition day. To ensure all teams have safely returned from the water, **every team is required to check in regardless if they have fish to weigh or not. Failure to go through the boat check in process at the end of either competition day will result in disqualification. Checking in may be done by Mobil Communications if a team has no fish to check in.** All fishing must cease upon check-in. Weigh-in bags will be provided by the fish handlers at the marina during the weigh-in process. This is to ensure the fish are kept healthy in live wells until the Weigh Master’s aerated tanks are available for the anglers use (limit of 12 teams in queue).
- 14. LATE PENALTY** - **Teams must arrive at the check-in site by their assigned flight time. There will be a one (1) pound penalty for each minute you are late up to 15 minutes. After that your weigh will not be counted.**
- 15. LIVE FISH** - Every effort must be made to keep bass alive with a properly aerated live well. **1 Pound** will be deducted from the total weight for each dead bass presented for weigh-in.
- 16. SCORING** - Scoring is determined by the final weight of each team’s catch during the tournament. Only largemouth, spotted, redeye or smallmouth bass are accepted species. The tournament limit is five bass per team. Teams possessing more than the tournament limit will have their catch to that point in the day disqualified and, time permitting, are eligible for a restart from the takeoff location. **Lake Fork has a**

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restrictive “Slot-Limit” and the following rules must be observed by all competitors regarding legal bass to be weighed.

For largemouth bass, length limit is a 16-24” slot. Bass under 16 inches or 24 inches or greater in length may be retained. Only one (1) one bass 24 inches or greater may be retained each day per contestant. There will be a question administered on the truth verification test. For smallmouth bass (if present), minimum length = 14 inches. No minimum length on spotted and Guadalupe bass (if present.) Daily bag limit for all four species = five (5) bass in combination.

Bass presented for weigh-in that fail to measure the prescribed length limit will be penalized at the rate of one (1) pound for each bass presented plus loss of that fish.

There will be a courtesy measuring board available to use. Check-it stick is the official measuring board. Each team’s catch must be presented in an official weigh-in bag. The winning team is determined by the heaviest catch for the combined two-day event.

- 17. **TIES** - Will be broken by big bass. If a tie remains, total number of fish weighed in for the tournament will break the tie. If a tie still remains, it will be broken by a flip of the coin.
- 18. **LOGO DISPLAY AND TELEVISION COVERAGE** - Contestants and coaches may wear their own shirts or jerseys during the tournament. Tournament officials reserve the right, in their sole discretion, to prohibit any contestant or coach’s shirt or jersey found to be offensive. All decisions are at the Tournament Director or Lake Fork Open Committee’s sole discretion.
- 19. **ALCOHOL AND TOBACCO** - During all days of competition any and all alcohol and tobacco logos are prohibited and may not be worn or displayed. Contestants may not smoke or use tobacco products during tournament hours, the weigh-in proceedings, or during the tournament registration process.
- 20. **TRUTH VERIFICATION TEST** - Each contestant and coach agrees to submit, by signature on the tournament entry form, to a polygraph or voice stress analysis examination and to abide by its conclusion. Failure to pass an examination will result in disqualification from the tournament. Truth verification tests will be used at the sole discretion of tournament officials, and the determination of the meaning of the results will be made solely by tournament officials.
- 21. **INSURANCE** - Liability insurance with coverage in reasonable amounts is required on all boats used in High School Fishing tournaments. Proof of insurance must be with the boat being used and must cover all passengers in the boat. Random checks will be conducted. Failure to provide proof of insurance when requested by the tournament director may result in disqualification.
- 22. **CAPTIONS** - The captions at the beginning of each paragraph are intended to facilitate convenience in referring to the various rules. The captions are not part of the substance of the paragraph and should not be used in construction of any paragraph or of this overall set of rules.
- 23. **In case of an emergency or boat break down**- If there is a medical emergency call 911 then call the Tournament Director, Micheal Rogge at 903-440-0525. If there is a boat break down, that team may enter another contestant boat with their catch to come to check-in. All fishing must stop at that time for both teams. The disabled boat can be towed in by a non-contestant boat but the team must remain in the tournament boat. Fishing must stop if the boat is being towed. If the disabled boat can be repaired and there is ample time, fishing can resume. Late penalty rule will still apply in any case.
